CAPTAIN JONATHAN DUFFY
DIRECTOR OF SEA COMBAT DIVISION, NAVAL SURFACE AND MINE
WARFIGHTING DEVELOPMENT CENTER

Capt. Jon Duffy is a native of Baltimore, Maryland and a 1994 graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy with a B.S. in Physics. He currently serves as the Director of Sea Combat Division at the Naval Surface and Mine Warfighting Development Center.



As a Division Officer at sea, Captain Duffy served as Gunnery Officer, Strike Officer, and Main Propulsion Assistant in USS Elliot (DD 967), and in USS Prinveton (CG 59) as the Fire Control Officer and Air Defense Officer. His Department Head tours were as the Operations Officer onboard USS Paul Hamilton (DDG 60) and USS Port Royal (CG 73). He served as Executive Officer in USS Pinckney (DDG 91). Captain Duffy commanded USS John Paul Jones (DDG 53), USS Antietam (CG 54), and Destroyer Squadron FIFTEEN homeported in Yokosuka, Japan.

Ashore, Captain Duffy has served as the Director for Defense Policy and Strategy on the National Security Council in The White House, as the Director of the Commander's Action Group for the Commander, U.S. Pacific Fleet, as the Executive Assistant to the Navy's Chief of Legislative Affairs, as the Flag Aide to the Commander of Naval Surface Forces, and he was assigned as the U.S. Naval Academy's 19th Company Officer, earning a Master's Degree in Leadership Education and Human Resource Development from the Naval Postgraduate School.
